

Two Hours' Truce at Sebastopol.

The day after the bloody combat of the 22d and 23d two hours' truce was agreed upon for the burial of the dead.

The sight was strange beyond description. French, English, and Russian officers were walking about saluting each other courteously as they passed, and occasionally entering into conversation.

While the men were engaged in placing the dead bodies upon litters and carrying them away, a lively conversation sprang up among the officers, in which the Russians indulged in a little badinage.

The Allies seemed to have improved the "excellent opportunity" to see the town. They reported large bodies of soldiers in the streets, assembled at the corners and in the public places.

There is one experiment which we would be glad to see fairly tried, on different soils and in different seasons. We would be glad to see common stable manure and guano applied, so as to be nearly equal in strength as possible, to two or more portions of land.

There can be no doubt that some vegetable productions may be so forced or stimulated by guano, as greatly to injure it not utterly destroy them.

We often see accounts of the successful application of guano to shrubs and fruit trees, and in minute quantities it might possibly be used to advantage.
