Several large bullocks lay on top the debris, and one ox of mammoth proportions was thrown half way into the second story window of the shop. Such of the swine as escaped uninjured seemed quite unconcerned about the matter, and extricating themselves from the ruins, were soon afterward rooting along the road or wal lowing in the mire.

The mass piled up against the machine shop reaches to the second story, and is composed of the remains of the locomotives, pieces of ears which are torn into shreds, mixed with the bodies of cattle, sheep and hogs. Several hogs crawled from under this pile, scemingly quite undisturbed. Cattle and parts of cattle were strewn all along the track, and we never witnessed a scene of more complete destruction.
