
POISONOUS THREADS .- A French journal of hygiene states that a number of seamstresses have suffered from violent colic, in consequence of putting into their mouths the silk they use Bank Notes bought and sold at a very small margin. in sewing. This disease is attributed to the practice of mixing the silk with a preparation of lead (the sulphate) so as to increase its weight. A chemical analysis of many different samples of sewing silk has been made by Mr Jones, of London, which resulted, in almost every case, in the detection of large quantities of acetate or sugar of lead.
