TO WHOLESALE BUYERS.

Thanking our numerous friends who in the past so lavishly bestowed their favors upon us, and thereby

as he may deem sufficient, to pursue and apprehend any felon who is a fugitive from justice whether within or without the limits of the State, and such detective force shall be in all things subject to the orders and direction of the Governor; shall report to him from time to time. and be paid by him for services, in no case exceeding five hundred dollars for the arrest and safe delivery to jail of any one felon.

Sec. 5. That the Governor is authorized to issue his warrant to the Public Treasurer, from time to time, for sufficient sums of money for the purposes required by this act. Sec. 6. That all laws and parts of laws, in conflict with the provisions of this act, are repealed. Sec. 7. That this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its ratification. Ratified this 19th day of February, A. D
