And every person having a right under the act entitled "An act to create an additional land District in the Territory of Wisconsin, and for other purposes," approved 2d March, 1847, or under any patent or permit, or under the act of Congress, or patents or permits any of the lands within the townships and fractional townships above enumerated, and who are entitled under the act entitled "An act to reduce the minimum price of the mineral lands in the Lake Superior District in Michigan and the Chipewagon District in Wisconsin," approved 26th September, 1850, to enter the land reserved by these laws, occupancy and permits respectively, at the minimum price of \$1 25 per acre, and covering more than one full section, notified "on the pre-emption of such lesser or present at the proper Land Office, to purchase, if he shall elect to do so, one full section," at the rate of \$20 per acre, as required to establish the same to the satisfaction of the Register and Receiver at Stillwater, and make payment therefor as soon as practicable after seeing this notice, and before the day appointed for the public sale, otherwise such claim will be forfeited.
