

WAS TEXAS PART OF THE ROMAN EMPIRE?—Mr. H. D. Patrick, of Texas, has found, at some distance below the surface of the ground, near Leon, an ancient copper coin, about the size of a cent. The original figures and letters on both sides, says the Galveston News, has been considerably defaced by the apparent corrosion of time. On one side, however, can be plainly seen the word "Cesar" on the outer edge, and over an image much like all such as we have seen of the Roman Emperor or other ancient deities. There are visible two or three faint letters of the word "Julius," on the left of "Cesar," and on the right some of the Roman numerals, evidently intended to show the date, but are too much corroded to be clearly made out. On the reverse side is the image of a Roman soldier, with a shield in one hand and the other elevated, but so much defaced that the weapon held is not visible.—N. O. Pricyune.
