FROM THE SEAT OF WAR.

The Battle at Manassas!! FULL PARTICULARS!!

Manassas Junction, Saturday night. During the greater part of yesterday afternoon the enemy was busy in burying their dead, near Bull Run. We have, however, information that the Northern forces were concentrated against us in immense numbers. They are throwing up earthworks and planting batteries with great energy, as if to renew the attack.

Gen. Patterson, with his entire force has abandoned Martinsburg and is now hastening to form a junction with McDowell. Troops are being thrown across the river in heavy bodies from Washington, and everything indicates that our position will be attacked shortly by an overwhelming force.

Gen. Beauregard, yesterday afternoon, issued orders that all Cavalry, woman and children, should leave Manassas Junction. He evidently anticipates a great battle here tomorrow.

The slaughter on both sides was terrible. Gen. Johnston, who had been summoned from Winchester, to assist with his horse, to the assistance of Beauregard, arrived with his whole force in time to take part. In the battle Gen. Beauregard led his horse out under the stars and stripes, Hampton's Legion to follow.

Gen. Johnston, during the thickest of the fight, seized the reins of the warring Regiment and called them in person to his charge.

It is impossible, at this moment, to estimate the number of dead and wounded. It is reported that the commander of the U. S. Forces, Gen. McDowell, was mortally wounded.

On our side, Col. Francis B. Hartow, of Savannah, Georgia, who was acting Brigadier General, was mortally wounded.

Gen. N. Y. Beane, of South Carolina, led the brigade first into action. Among the Southern forces prominently engaged, were Col. Swan, 4th Regiment, Col. Kerens, 24th Regiment, and Colonel Wade Hampton's Legion, all of South Carolina Volunteers. Only three men were wounded in Col. Kerens's Regiment.

Reports that reach us here state that our forces is no less than 75,000 men, all told, and that the enemy had over 100,000. These statements are probably exaggerated; but, it is certain that the leaders on both sides had concentrated their whole available forces to take part in the battle.

Among the Officers known to have been killed, in addition to those I have named above, is Kuny Smith, of Florida.

At one time, during the battle, Sherman's celebrated U. S. Flying Artillery was on the point of destroying Hampton's Legion, when Col. GARLAND, of 11th Virginia Regiment, was ordered to charge the Battery at the point of the Bayonet.

Rev. Mr. Davis, Methodist Minister, stationed at Key West, was arrested on the 22nd ult. by the Lincolnites, and imprisoned. He was only released on condition that he would leave the island.
