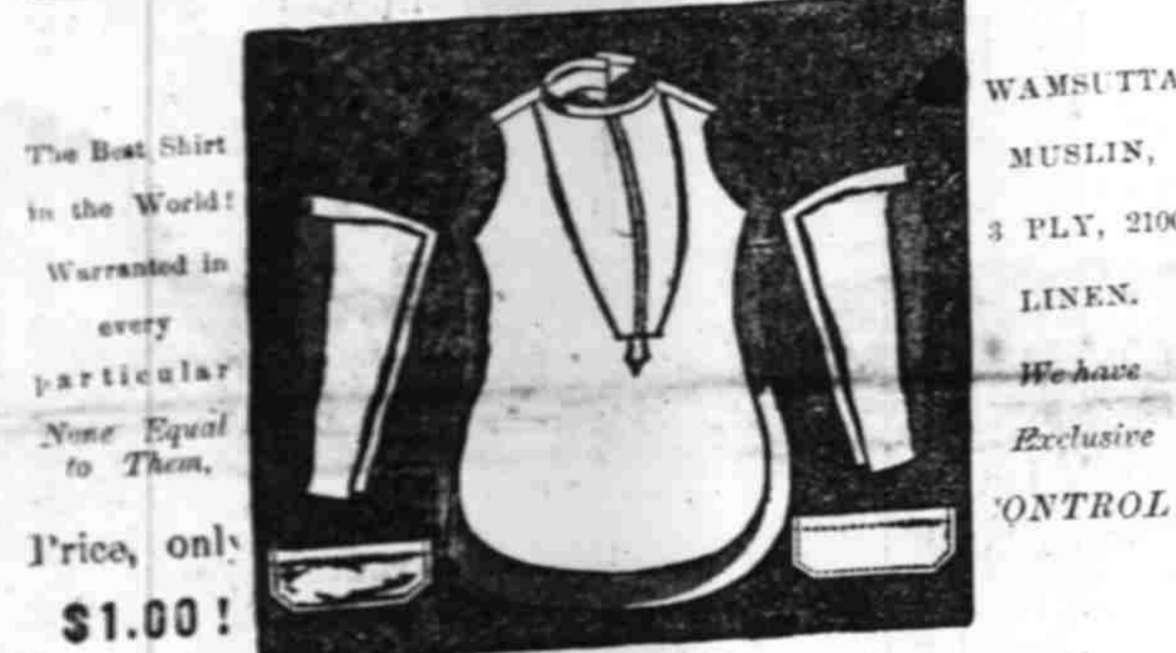

The Eastern War.

London, Oct. 6.—The Daily News correspondent, with Gen. Melikoff's army, telegraphing from Basra, says: "At 3 o'clock this afternoon the Russians were surrounded by Kizil Tepi when Mukhtar Pasha, desperate at seeing his communications with Kars threatened, advanced against our centre with 20 battalions."

Mexican Border Difficulties.

The reports of invasion of Texas by lawless hordes from Mexico come to us by telegraph, giving information of outrageous acts of violence. The lives of people are threatened, a Judge made prisoner and bound with ropes and the county officers terrorized by the desperadoes.

Congress.

DEMOCRATIC VICTORY.

Newark, N. J., October 10.—In the municipal election the Democrats gain five aldermen, five school trustees, five free holders. The workingmen's ticket polled 1,549 votes. The vote was light—over 1,200 less than last year.
