DICK HAWES HANGED

AN ALABAMA MURDERER PAYS THE DEATH PEN. ALTY--BRUTAL TRIPLE MURDER.

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., February 28.—The trap which sent Dick Hawes into eternity fell at one minute past 1 o'clock today.

This morning he spent with his spiritual advisers, and at 12:45 o'clock he was brought out to the scaffold.

Two minutes later he addressed those about the scaffold, saying: "I want to say to this congregation that I have made a written statement."

After he had ceased speaking, Sheriff Smith roused the mob and a minute later the trap was sprung.

Great interest is evinced here in Hawes' statement, which he wrote a few days ago. The paper is in the hands of the sheriff and is to be published at once.

HAWES' CRIME.

The crime for which Richard R. Hawes paid the penalty with his life today on the gallows was the murder of his wife and two children.

The discovery led to still further investigation, and the residence of Hawes was visited by several persons, who found the place deserted and evidence that a horrible crime had been committed.

The children, he said, had been placed in a convent at Mobile, and he was at a loss to understand how May's body came to be found where it was.
