PAN-AMERICAN VISIT TO THE SOUTH.

It is said to be definitely settled that the Pan-American Congress will make the tour of the South, and see for themselves our sunny Southland. This is as it should be, for they will thus see for themselves the enterprise and energy of that New South that sprang from the ashes of defeat at Appomattox and Bennett's house. We believe great good will result to the United States from the Pan-American Congress, as well as to the other two Americas.

We hope the Congress may be able to visit Durham, and view our gigantic manufactures, especially of tobacco. There is no better representative of the New South than the pushing, thriving young city of Durham.

THAT LEAKY SENATE.

Again we are refreshed with the old Senatorial fuss about the leaks of the Senate Chamber. The public has tired of the matter and become disgusted with it. The secret proceedings of that once august body in executive session, are as regularly and as truthfully reported as the open legislative sessions.

Who are the leaky Senators that divulge the secret debates and proceedings? To answer this question the irate Senate propose to jail and fine the Reporters of the great dailies unless they divulge the names.

A better way would be to improve the morals of Senators in honor and integrity, so no Senator would be so lost to all sense of shame and honor, as to divulge the secret of the Senate. Failing in this, let them abolish the secret executive session: what a difference between the Senate as it once was, and as it is now. But do not visit the sins of the dishonorable Senators upon the newspaper reporter.

THE SUGAR PLANTERS AND THE TARIFF.

It is announced that the Ways and Means Committee will reduce the tariff on sugar 25 or 30 per cent. This has raised the ire of the sugar beet and sarghum sugar planters. They are organizing to fight the reduction in the House and Senate.

We have never regarded the tariff on sugar as onerous or oppressive; there are many others that far more deserve attention and reduction; but what we wish to emphasize is this; if protection is the assured policy of the government, then let that protection be extended as fully to the farmer as to the manufacturer.

The sugar planters say they can stand 15 per cent reduction; but if this reduction is to place the sugar planting interest in the powerful grip of a foreign sugar trust or combine, and thereby crush an industry of the farm, we are opposed to it. Let the protection be just as ample to the farm as to the factory.

The American Sugar Trust which threatened at one time, to crush the sugar planter, has been burst by the combined action of the Courts and the oppositions of Claus Spreckels the California Sugar King. But this does not protect the sugar planter from a future trust either at home or in foreign lands. In truth, the foreign syndicate or trust is becoming dangerous.

Some one may ask, what interest has North Carolina in the matter? We are not going to demand protection to the rice and tobacco of North Carolina, without conceding the same to the sugar of Louisiana, the North west, and the Pacific slope. We are patriotic enough to take in the whole Union with all its farming interests. Besides we believe there are large areas in this State that can be profitably cultivated in raising sorghum and the sugar beet for sugar. We emphasize the fact, that if protection is to be the policy of the government, let it be given as fully to the farm as to the factory.

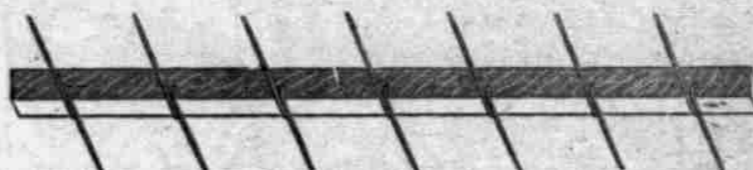
