THE SUGAR PLANTERS AND THE TARIFF.

It is anounced that the Ways and Means Committee will reduce the tariff on sugar 25 or 30 per cent. This has raised the ire of the sugar beet and sarghum sugar planters. They are organizing to fight the reduction in the House and Senate.

We have never regarded the tariff on sugar as operous or oppressive; there are many others that for more deserve attention and reduction; but what we wish to emphasize is this; if protection is the assured policy of the government, then let that protec tion be extended as fully to the farmer as to the manufacturer.

The sugar planters say they can stand 15 per cent seduction; but if this reduction is to place the sugar planting interest in the powerful grit of a foreign sugar trust or combine, and thereby crush an industry of the farm, we are opposed to it. Let the protection be just as ample to the farm as to the factory.

The American Sugar Trust which threatened at one time, to crush the sugar planter, has been bursted by the combined action of the Courts and the opporations of Claus Spreek els the California Sugar King But this does not protect the sugar plant r from a future trust either at home or in foreign lands. In toth, the foreign syndicate or true as becoming dangerous.

Some one may ask, what interest has North Carolina in the matter? We are not going to demand protection to the rice and t.bacco of North Carolina, without conceding he same to the sugar of Louisiana, the North west, and the Pacific slope. We are patriotic enough to take in the whole Union with all its farming int rest. Besides we believe there are large areas in this State that can be profit ably cultivated in raising sorghum and the sugar best for engar. We emphasize the fact, that if protection is to be the policy of the government, let it be given as fully to the farm as to the factory.
