THE COTTON FIELDS ARE WHITE.

Tobacco Damaged to a Great Extent.

FALKLAND, PITT CO., N. C., Oct. 6.—DEAR READER:—It is a pleasure for me to send news to you and my friends in old Durham; but when misfortune overtakes us it is somewhat difficult. We are having damp, dirty weather at this time in the low lands of Pitt. While the cotton fields remain white with its fruit, some of our farmers have housed as good as none, while some have gathered the first opening. The scarcity of land here caused considerable trouble among some of the cotton farmers.

Tobacco is damaged to a great extent, where farmers were not rightly prepared to take care of it. Some few have nicely arranged pack-houses, while others put their tobacco in open out-houses.

Farmers round about Falkland are very much dissatisfied with their last shipments to the Oxford and Henderson markets. But we Pitt county people must be judge enough of a male to know he is worth \$50.00 before we slip him and expect to get \$50.00 clear of all expenses.

Duke & Sons, the largest cigarette manufacturers in the world, after spending several days in the city, left for home Wednesday night. He was looking for a suitable site for the erection of a branch manufactory of the Duke people. A certain piece of real estate not far from the Read house had been selected.

LINCOLN'S MELANCHOLY.

His Sympathetic Nature and His Early Misfortunes.

Those who saw much of Abraham Lincoln during the later years of his life, were greatly impressed with the expression of profound melancholy on his face always wore in repose. Mr. Lincoln was of peculiarly sympathetic and kindly nature. These strong characteristics influenced, very happily, as it proved, his entire political career. They would not seem, at first glance, to be efficient aids to political success; but in the peculiar emergency which Lincoln, in the providence of God, was called to meet, no vessel of common clay could possibly have become the "chosen of the Lord."

Those acquainted with his from boyhood knew that early griefs tinged his whole life with sadness. His partner in the grocery business at Salem, was "Uncle" Billy Green, of Iadula, Ill., who used at night, when the customers were few, to hold the grammar while Lincoln recited his lessons.

It was to his sympathetic ear Lincoln told the story of his love for sweet Ann Rutledge; and he, in return, offered what comfort he could when poor Ann died, and Lincoln's great heart nearly broke.

"After Ann died," says "Uncle" Billy, "on stormy nights, when the wind blew the rain against the roof, Abe would sit there in the grocery, his elbows on his knees, his face in his hands, and the tears running through his fingers. I hated to see him feel that way, but I'd say, 'Abe don't cry; an' look up an' say 'I can't help it, but the rain's a fallin' on her.'"

There are many who can sympathize with this overpowering grief, as they think of a lost loved one, when "the rain's a fallin' on her." What sad pregnancy to the grief sometimes is the thought that the lost one might have been saved.
