**CANNING INDUSTRY.**  
 BALTIMORE, Md., March 16.  
 —When one takes into consideration the multitude of minor products that find their way to markets in hermetically sealed packages, the result is simply marvelous.

It is estimated that 350 varieties of fruits, vegetables, fish and meats are packed during their seasons. There is almost no limit to the possibilities of canned food if it is rightly packed and placed before the people. We are so accustomed to having this easily digested, healthful food, that we look upon it as a matter of course, and often forget what a privilege we enjoy. In no part of the country has this industry brighter prospects than in the South. At the present time the question is agitating the public mind, especially the investor, who by his sharp insight of the business world, can see a greater margin on each can of fruit or vegetable packed in the South, over the same kind and class of goods made ready for the market in the North. Now to bring the subject home to your own cities and counties, have you sufficient fruit and vegetables to supply factories of this kind of which I speak? Certainly! Why it has been said and is known to be a fact, with an average crop, the fruit that falls from the trees, and the vegetables that is allowed to decay, within the limits of numbers of your counties, would if sold more than pay the taxes of those counties. Think of this enormous waste then picture to yourself the extra amount of money that would be saved to farmers, if there were canning factories in operation that would consume the surplus fruit that grows to abundance in your section. What has been trees of former years is liable to keep on in the same way for the next half century, unless the hand of man comes to the rescue. An investment of this kind pays larger profits on the capital, besides being of much benefit to the city or county where the factory is located. Many have been under the impression that the necessary machinery for conducting this industry is expensive, but such is far from the fact. The capital required is easily within reach of almost every farmer in the South, and can be carried on in connection with his work. The manufacturers of the machinery furnish instructions for putting up the outfit and also furnish all the processes of the various fruits and vegetables, so that you can successfully operate your own canning without the aid of skilled labor.

To operate a factory with capacity of 2000 3lb cans per day will require 12 hands, viz: 7 to prepare the material for the cans, 2 for filling the cans, one capper and tipper, one fireman, and one processor. The processing and capping is easily acquired, the balance of the work can be done by women or children or other cheap labor. A building 20x40 is a very suitable one for this outfit. Numbers of the outfits are operated in Maryland and elsewhere and give employment to thousands of workers.

The cost of canning one case (24 cans) of tomatoes is about \$1.25; selling price \$1.90; peaches, \$2.25, selling price \$3.00; blackberries, \$1.15, selling price \$1.70; apples, \$1.55, selling price \$2.20; corn, \$1.30, selling price \$2.00; peas \$2.00, selling price \$3.00.

Now when you take into consideration that with the 2000 3lb can capacity per day, you can put up 83 cases, you can realize the handsome profits to be derived from this industry. In reference to disposing of your goods, if you have not a home market, brokers can always be found here that will find a convenient market for you at a trifling cost.

The markets are more bare of canned goods of every variety than they have been for years at this season, the reason is that packers sold as soon as packed all they got up and at good profits.
