## RESULT OF ELECTION IN COUNTY AND STATE

### Three Republican Congressmen and Bryan's Majority Will Be Less Than 20,000

### BROOKS' DEFEAT ONE OF THE SURPRISES OF THE DAY

### Democrats Lose in the Fifth, Eighth and Tenth Districts. Durham Democratic by Varying Majorities.--Harward Leads the County Ticket.

The result of the election in North Carolina was what some say they expected; but many had been led to believe that the State would send a solid Democratic Congress to Washington. However, this will not be the case as the Fifth, Eighth and Tenth Districts will be represented by Republicans.

Brooks, in the Fifth district, was defeated by 343 votes majority for Morehead. Charles H. Cowles, Republican of the eighth district, was elected with a majority of 1,800 over Hackett. John G. Grant, Republican, won out over W. T. Crawford in the tenth district with a majority of 355. All other congressmen elected were Democrats.

The entire state ticket was elected by Democrats, the majorities ranging from 20,000 for Bryan to 42,000 for Kitchin.

### ORANGE ELECTION NEWS.

The Observer Gives Unofficial Returns, But They are about Correct.

The election in Orange County passed off quietly and was hotly contested by the friends of the various candidates.

Unofficial returns indicate the election of Sparrow, Republican, over Gattis, Democrat, by a majority of 60 to 75.

Sheriff Andrews, Democrat, is re-elected Sheriff over Miller, Republican, by about 115 majority.

Charles Strayhorn, Democrat, is elected Clerk of the Court.

Uncle Joe Laws, Democrat, the old veteran Register of Deeds, will continue to issue marriage licenses. His majority is 300.

Parrish, Democrat, claims his election as County Treasurer by about 45 majority over Cole, Republican.

It will take the official count to decide the election of County Commissioners. The returns indicate the election of two Democrats, J. D. Webb and Charles E. Wilson, and Wm. R. Lloyd, Republican.

The Board of County Convassers will meet in the court house at Hillsboro on Thursday, Nov. 5th to canvass the county returns.

Kitchin is elected Governor of North Carolina by a large majority. In this Senatorial District Manning, Democrat, of Durham, and J. L. Scott, Jr. Democrat, of Alamance, are elected.

Jones Fuller is elected Solicitor without opposition.

The News and Observer claims the State for the Democrats by 40,000 majority and concedes Taft's election by a considerable majority.
