Higher prices for foreign wool in London have compelled domestic manufacturers to pay more for a raw material. At present quotations foreign wools in domestic markets can be sold abroad at a profit.

There were 9,299 mercantile failures in the United States during the past nine months, as reported to Bradstreet's, only 48 more than in the like portion of last year, which coincidence is paralleled by the total amounts of assets and liabilities of failing traders this year being substantially the same as in the like period one year ago.

BUSINESS PROSPECTS SOUTH.

The Manufacturers' Record recently stated that the high price of cotton this year would offset the decrease in acreage. Following out the same thought, the New York Journal of Commerce claims that this year's crop has been produced at a cost of more than \$40,000,000 less than last year's, while it is probable that higher prices will cause the total value of the crop to be larger even than that of last year's 10,000,000 bales yield. According to the Journal of Commerce's calculations, the crop this year ought to be worth to the South in net results at least \$50,000,000 more than last year's was.
