

Key West, July 9 .- Officers of he blockading fleet report the destruction of the Spanish steamer Villa Verde, off Port Mariel, loaded with ammunition and supplies for Blanco.

The vessel was sighted at midnight, and by Wednesday dawn was completely destroyed. The blockading steamship Hawk overhauled her steaming eastward close to the shore, and fired across her bows, which was ineffectual. The Hawk then opened fire in earnest disabling her and setting her on fire. The Spanish boat theu ran ashore and beached. The Hawk was reenforced by the Castine, and well-directed shot from the latter blew her to pieces.
