Supreme Court Decides the Contest in Beckham's Favor

Washington, May 21.-The Kentucky governorship case was today decided by the United States Supreme Court in the interest of Beckham, Democrat, ffirming the decision of the Kentucky Court of Appeals. The opinion was handed down by Chief Justice Fuller, and the case was dismissed for want of jurisdiction. The opinion in the case was not unanimous.
