### A LESSON IN TARIFF.

Statistics just issued from Washington show that the imports of iron and steel during the fiscal year of 1904 will be only about one-half as large as they were in the fiscal year 1903.

During the ten months ended with April last the imports of iron and steel amounted to only \$23,075,064, as compared with \$43,332,714 in the same period of last year. On the other hand, the exports of iron and steel during the current fiscal year will show a material increase amounting to at least \$10,000,000 more than in the fiscal year 1903.

The explanation is simple. During the fiscal year of 1903, the price of American iron and steel was abnormally high, yet there was a brisk demand for all that could be produced in the United States, and more. Foreigners were thus enabled to pay the high tariff tax on imports of iron and steel, and yet sell their product in the United States at a profit. On the other hand, prices at home were so high that our iron producing concerns shipped very little of their product abroad. But recently there has been a considerable decline in the price of American iron, and as a result imports have fallen off and exports have increased.
