

WHITES LEAVE.

Negroes Were Placed in School With White Children and the Parents of the Latter Withdraw Their Children From the School.

The patrons of the Goodwin school, in Clark county, Indian, have taken a firm stand against their children attending school with negro pupils and have withdrawn them until the matter is settled. Near the school house lives a colored farmer named Sawyer. He owns his farm and is regarded as a worthy citizen. He has no children, but his grandchildren live with him. Yesterday he took three of his grandchildren to school and had them enrolled as pupils, but as soon as the teacher assigned the children to seats all the white pupils picked up their books and left.

A meeting of the parents was called and they definitely decided that if the "niggers" were taught in the school the white children should not attend. The trustees called upon Sawyer and asked him to send his grandchildren to a colored school some distance away. Sawyer stood on his rights and refused to send his grandchildren to the more distant school. The parents wanted the teacher to refuse instruction to the negroes, but she was advised that she could not do so. None of the whites will return to school unless the negroes are dismissed, and they will likely be the only pupils in school this year.

MANLINESS OF THE MAN.

Referring to President Roosevelt's famous pension order No. 78, where in he usurped legislative authority, and the republican spell-binders' inquiry, "What are you going to do about it?" Judge Parker, in his letter of acceptance, boldly announces, "If elected I will revoke that order."

Thus the leader of the democratic hosts takes up the gauntlet thrown down by the violators of constitutional law, and lifts on high the banner of right and honesty.

The utterance above quoted will go down in history with that of Clay, who said, "I would rather be right than be President," but it will more fully awaken the minds of the American voters to-day than did the words of Clay, spoken many years ago, when Rooseveltism did not threaten the balance scales, when the constitution was not harassed by executive usurpation and when corruption in high places did not so greatly jeopardize the liberties of the people.

If it be true that courage enlarges resource, certain it is that Judge Parker has opened new fields for a cultivation of patriotic democratic principles by this one answer to the republican party. It demonstrates that he is to-day honored on truth and justice, who fact qualifies him most nobly, in such a crisis as this, for the highest seat in the gift of the American people.

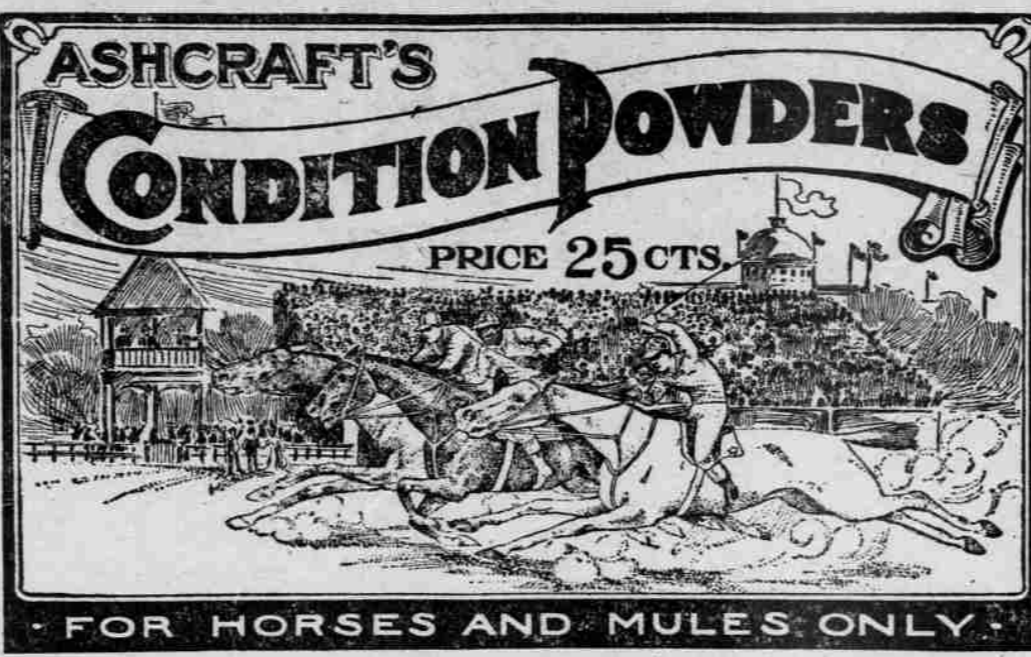
