UNPRECEDENTED.

Republican Senators Give Tillman Honor of Reporting R. Rate Bill.

Washington, Feb. 23.—By a vote of 8 to 6, the senate committee on interstate commerce today agreed to report the Hepburn railroad rate bill without amendment, but the resolution adopted reserves to the members of the committee freedom of action concerning amendments offered in the senate.

By a vote of five to three Republicans prevailing, Senator Tillman, a Democrat, was given the honor of reporting the bill. This establishes a precedent in the history of the senate committee on interstate commerce. A Democratic control in regard to the measure passed by a Republican house and a Republican side in the senate.

The following is a summary of the bill:

It gives the interstate commerce commission authority, when a rate is unreasonable, to investigate the facts, state whether or not it is unreasonable and if found to be unreasonable to fix a rate which it is to be just and reasonable and fairly remunerative, which is to be the maximum rate to be charged.

Another important feature is the definition of the words "railroad" and "transportation" in a manner to include all auxiliary instrumentalities of the common carrier and to bring them within the control of the commission.

AS TO CORN.

Now That the Farmers are Getting Organized Why Talk About Cotton Alone?

Now that the farmers are becoming organized—primarily to control the price of cotton—would it not be advisable for them, while insisting their concerns, to talk together upon other crops as well as cotton?

Over in Virginia the farmers at this time are giving much attention to the culture of alfalfa—for a general feed for all kinds of stock, and the Southern Railway is running a special train all over its system, in that state to convey from station to station, where farmers' meetings are held, lecturers who are experts in the culture of alfalfa to talk to the farmers.

The Argus devotes much of its space to this issue to a treatise on corn culture by a Mr. Williams, of South Carolina, and we invite our farmer readers to a careful perusal and earnest consideration of the subject.

It seems to us that the prosperity of the South hinges largely upon corn culture. If Southern farmers will curtail their cotton culture—so as not to over produce that crop—and will multiply the number of stock kept on their farms—cattle, hogs, sheep, poultry, etc.—there is independent wealth in store for them.

Limited cotton production and unlimited stock production will quickly make the South the richest section of the United States. The man who shows the South how to stop the tremendous drain on this section caused by the importation of Western corn and meat will deserve the unanimous thanks of our entire Southland.
