TAFT FOR SUPREME COURT

Will Take Justice Brown's Place, and Upon Fuller's Retirement Will Be Elevated To Chief Justice-ship.

Washington, March 9.—The Post today says:
"President Roosevelt has decided to appoint William H. Taft to the vacant position of Chief Justice of the United States supreme court."
"Fast vacancy will be created by the voluntary retirement of Associate Justice Henry B. Brown, who was appointed in 1890 by President Harrison from the state of Michigan."
"When Chief Justice Fuller retires, provided it is during the administration of President Roosevelt, Mr. Taft will be promoted to his exalted position."
"The President has discussed the entire situation with his cabinet of war, and the latter it was learned last night, has given his assent to the programme."
"This is the second time Mr. Taft has been offered a place on the supreme bench. The first time was in the winter of 1896, when it was serving as governor of the Philippine island."

SENATE SAYS NO.
Roosevelt Receives Decided Set Back.

Washington, March 9.—By a majority of thirteen votes the senate today turned down President Roosevelt's proposition to put a tariff on Arizona and New Mexico, leaving to the citizens of those states the right to vote to determine their status.

The result in the senate is regarded as important as showing the temper of that body against the recommendations of the President. Closely following the defeat of the Philippine tariff bill in the senate committee, controlled by a majority of the republicans, the defeat of the administration's plan relative to joint statehood has contributed one more count to the President and his supporters in the upper branch of congress.

DISASTER NOT MAGNIFIED
1,100 French Miners Imprisoned in Coal Pits.

Paris, March 11.—The worst fears as to the enormity of the mine disaster in the Courrières district of the Pas-de-Calais Saturday morning have been realized. The death list numbers 1,100, and the waste of the region stands appalled at the terrible tragedy, which has brought sorrow to 6,000 fathers, mothers, wives and children.

The last great mine disaster occurred in France in 1885, when 293 persons were killed and 80 injured; but that and all others sink into insignificance before Courrières.

The vast mortuary camp is under military guard, 400 soldiers having arrived there to assist in holding in check the crowds of distracted mourners.

Weather and Crops.
Just at present the weather wise are discussing the law of averages. Each year they claim, presents normal and level figures. They reason therefore that a mild winter will be followed by a cool summer—light snowfalls by heavy rains—and that there will, therefore, be poor crops this year after two years of plenty. Cotton, it is claimed, will encounter this year too many downpours and too little sunshine, and it will be a crop below ten millions bales. They see trouble coming to the corn crop, to the peach trees, to one thing or another, and the net result is to be short crops and a great deal of losses.

All this is borrowing trouble in advance. It is borrowing trouble with no trustworthy statistics at hand to support the theory. The weather statistics of thirty years—official statistics—do not show that a mild winter is followed by poor crops, some mild winters have been so allowed, and so we have not. The statistics have no lessons to present at that point. Neither anybody or anything else, just as always, in March have ever been and ever will be. No one knows what the crops of the year will prove to be, and it is every man's duty to go ahead wholly regardless of the croakers and the long range weather prophets.

Early peach and pear trees are in full bloom and we are thus reminded that winter is about over and of the approach of the good Spring time, when all nature seems to smile, and no merry birds fill the air with their happy carolling. It is at this season of the year, with the budding of the leaves and the blooming of the flowers, that the handwork of God is more apparent, and we have the double assurance, which casteth away every doubt, that our Redeemer liveth, and is still blessing mankind. And while old mother earth is thus clothed in gala attire and everything is so beautiful and the air is full of the fragrance of sweet flowers, and we feel an aspiration which comes at no other season, yet He has prepared for the redeemed who remain faithful until the end, a far more beautiful home than this, where when we have fulfilled our mission here, we may spend the endless ages of eternity in peace and happiness and in praise to Him who gave His life a ransom for the sins of the whole world.
