THE MATTER WITH KAN-SAS.

In view of a number of incidents which have transpired in that state of late, the old familiar question is being revived, "What's the matter with Kansas?"

Of course there are a great many answers to this question, not including floods, cyclones, wild-cat politics, Mary Ellen Leases, Carrie Nations, and so on. The fact is there are so many things the matter with Kansas it is hard to find time to enumer-

One thing, however, which does not seem to have been widely commented on is the fact that Kansas appears to have a great deal of trouble with its United States senators. One senator from Kansas committed suicide, one retired years ago to escape the humiliation of expulsion, one was defeated for re-election by evidence that he purchased votes; one had his election investigated by the senate committee which reported that bribery in his interest was proved, but that it was not clear he was a party to the same or that a sufficient number of votes were purchased to change the result. And, then Burton, the convicted grafter, risings, belching, heartburn and all stomach who is under a prison sentence, and disorders. who resigned from the senate just before his tellow senators were ready to expel him.

Kansas does a lot of boasting. 




