Newspaper Laws.

1. A Postmaster is required to give notice by LETTER, (returning paper does not answer the law) when a subscriber does not pay his bill or part of the office, state the reasons for its not being taken, and a neglect to do so makes the Postmaster responsible to the publisher for payment.

2. Any person who takes a paper from the Postoffice, whether it is delivered to his name or another or whether he has subscribed to it, is responsible for the pay.

3. If any person orders his paper discontinued, he must pay all arrears, or the publisher may cause to send an until payment is made, in full or in part, the amount, whether it be taken from the office or not. The case becomes legal discontinuation until the payment is made.

4. If the subscriber orders his paper to be stopped at a certain time, and the publisher continues to send, the subscriber is bound to pay for it if he takes it out of the Post office. The law proceeds on the ground that a man must pay for what he uses.

5. The Courts have decided that refusing to take newspapers and periodicals from the Postoffice, or removing and having them unsealed for it is prima facie evidence of intentional fraud.
