Newspaper Laws.

1. A Postmaster is required to give notice by LETTER, (returning a paper does not answer the law) when a subscriber does not take his paper out of the office, the reasons for not being taken, and a notice to do so makes the Postmaster responsible to the public for the payment.

2. Any person who takes a paper from the Postoffice, whether delivered to his name or another, or whether he has subscribed or not, is responsible for the pay.

3. If any person orders his paper discontinued, he must pay all arrears, or the publisher may continue to send it until payment is made, unless it is a small amount, whether it be taken from the office or not. The cost of legal disbursements will be paid by the person making the order.

4. If the subscriber orders his paper to be stopped at a certain time, and the publisher continues to send it, the subscriber is bound to pay for it if he takes it out of the Postoffice. The law proceeds on the ground that a man must pay for what he takes.

5. Postmasters have decided that refusing to take news-papers and periodicals from the Postoffice, or removing and leaving them would be prima facie evidence of intentional fraud.
