James Law, Binding Cases, ditto. page 517, says hogs have apparently a similar disease to the cholera which this remedy does not prevent, caused by a different worm, inhabiting the intestines, lungs and bodies of the animal. Thus, on page 517, he describes a supposed cholera which was only cured by the free use of tobacco, which cleared the hogs of worms.
