Diversity of Opinion among the Yankees.

HENDERSON'S SPEECH.

There are but two sides to the question .-The one is Union without slavery ; the other is the immediate and unconditional acknowledgment of the Southern Confederacy. * * * * *

Therefore. let the elements of opposition at once combine so that the friends of the Union-may determine upon the best course to secure peace. If these demons are too strong to be subdued except at the expense of our own liberties and the loss of every good for which the Government was established, the sooner we know the fact and act upon it the better.

If it become evident that the friends of slavery are strong enough in this country to resist all reasonable efforts to subdue them. I shall act upon it. I am not prepared to ruin t' e country in a vain effort to do what cannot b done. Shall this war go on foreve. ? Is this common cry of "the last man and the last dollar" poetry, patriotism, braggadocio? Should the war go on until the public debt equals the entire wealth of the country? Should the whole capital of the people be forced into Federal securities, and the securities made the basis of an irredeemable paper circulation ? From the Nassau Advertiser, April 23. Monumental Cenotaph in Memory

of Gen. Stonewall Jackson. We lataly examined a very chaste piece of Architectural work of art, built by the talented young artist Mr. T. J. Mott, * of the firm of Schrimshaw & Mott, News dealers, Frederick street. Is is designed as a Monumental Cenotaph for General Stonewall Jackson, the hero of the Confederate army, who died in the battle of Chancellersville, May 2d, 1863. It is composed entirely of shells taken from the sea shore of the Bahama Islands and from the shores of Dixie. The following are the measurements of this beautiful work of art-together with the mottos and devices . The base of the Monument is three feet square—the bottom of the shaft, contains four Arches with the Tomb in the centre.— Next above the bottom of the shaft are four handsome Panels, each bearing different inscriptions, viz: on the first Panel are two Confederate Flags crossed, with the General's motto-"Do your duty and leave the rest to Providence ?" and his last words-"It is all right." On the second panel appears his Epitaph :-TO THE MEMORY OF GENERAL STONEWALL JACKSON, who fell at CHANCELLORSVILLE,
