A caboose and passenger coach, which broke loose from a Southern railway freight train at Belmont, Gaston county, Saturday night, crashed into the train and fatally injured L. D. Caldwell, of King's Mountain, a passenger, and seriously injured J. R. Hardin, a flagman.

Badly mutilated, the dead bodies of Felix Brounard, his wife and three children, negroes, were found Sunday in their home at Lake Charles, La., making the second wholesale negro murder in that State within a week and the sixth within the year.

The United States board of engineers has recommended that Cape Lookout, on the North Carolina coast, eight miles north of Beaufort, be made a harbor of refuge.

Prisoners in New Hanover county jail attacked the jailer Saturday night and but for the prompt assistance of a negro prisoner the jailer would have been overpowered.
