The average annual toll of typhoid fever in our army before vaccinatio was begun was 536 cases and 37 deaths per 100,000 soldiers. In 191 the treatment was made optional and the rate fell to 232 cases and 1 deaths. In March, 1911, the treatment was made compulsory and the rate fell to 80 cases and 11 deaths. In 1912 there were only 26 cases and three deaths. There have been no deaths in the army since 1912.


