Wednesday was made a notable day in North Carolina, the occasion of the opening of the mile and half concrete bridge spanning the Chowan river. Up to this time the half dozen northeastern counties had been physically separated from the rest of the state. This feat of engineering has brought the "lost colonies" into the state's fold. Gov. McLean, from his vacation quarters in Wisconsin, sent back an inspiring message which was delivered by Lieut.-Gov. J. Elmer Long.

Col. Alston D. Watts, an unique figure in North Carolina politics for 30 years or more, died in Statesville, in the county of his birth, last Friday, aged 61 years. At one time he was U. S. deputy. collector of internal revenue for the Western district. The last office he held was State Commissioner of Revenue. He served in both houses of the State legislature, and was one time secretary to Congressman John S. Henderson and Senator Simmons. He and devoted his talents to the success of the Democratic party. He was a political wizard. The Republicans feared him and the Democrats obeyed him. He is reputed to have known more political figures and facts than
