Since the war, when I voted at all, my ballot has always been cast in favor of Democracy; and as I am now, and always have been, in full sympathy with that party on every question, except that of License, if, as it is plainly to be seen, one of the old political parties must triumph in the contest, I shall not allow myself to be used as an instrumentality in putting my friends in North Carolina under the dominion of negro rule. Hence, I hereby decline the candidacy and withdraw from the Third Party, and earnestly recommend my life long friend and brother, Maj. S. M. Finger, who is a Christian


