

Harrison's Record.
While in the United States Senate General Harrison voted against reducing the tariff on agricultural implements and tools of mechanics. See Congressional Record, volume XIV, page 1,784, 47th Congress.
He also voted against reducing the tariff rate on cotton bagging. See Congressional Record, volume XIV, page 2,582.
He also voted against the repeal of the tobacco tax. See Congressional Record, volume XIV, page 2,577.
He also voted against reducing the tax on tobacco from 12 to 8 cents a pound. See Congressional Record, volume XIV, page 2,378.
He also voted against reducing the tax on brandy and whiskey from 90 to 50 cents. See Congressional Record, volume XIV, page 2,378.
On Friday, the 14th of February, 1883, Senator Brown, of Georgia, offered the following amendment to the bill then before the Senate: "And all laws now in force imposing a tax or providing for the collection of a tax, known as an internal revenue law, on whiskey and brandy, be hereby repealed."
On this amendment the yeas and nays were called, and Senator Harrison voted in the negative. See Congressional Record XIV, page 1,78 47th Congress, 2d session.
