The Venezuelan republic declared its independence of Spain 10 in 1811 and was at warfare with the mother country for nearly ten years thereafter. Bolivar, a native of Caracas, was the leading spirit of the revolt. The independence of the republic was not recognized by Spain nutil 1845. In December, 1870, Gumzau Blanco was declared provisional dictator and acted as dictator until 1873, when he was elevated constitutional president for four years.
