Styles In Wall Coverings. Some of the handsomest paperings which have ever been shown are of imitation leather embossed in heraldic designs. The Standard Designer tells that carving. This material is most artistic for dining rooms and libraries and associates very effectively with leather furniture. When heraldic designs are not used, conventional floral patterns or Persian figures are employed. Somecontrasting hues, and sometimes it is left in the natural tint and shaded in darker brown or tan to resemble the burnt leather which is one of the popular fancies of the present day. Tapestry is also closely imitated for drawing rooms and dining rooms. In this even the stitches are copied with the closest fidelity, and the patterns are reproduced from the old tapestries. Sometimes panels of these are set in oak framing for dining rooms with excellent effect. Lincrusta walton is more in demand than ever for panels, dados and ceilings. In cream and gold it is much used in drawing rooms, where the panels are set in between real silk or satin drapery, or when made in imitation of leather it is framed in wood in a manner similar to the tapestries mentioned above. In metallic colors lincrusta walton is also largely used in vestibules and corridors. When one does not wish to go to the expense of having a ceiling frescoed, he can obtain beautiful papering for this purpose in Louis XIV and Marie Antoinette designs, with benters, wreathes and festoons in soft coloring, delicately touched here and there with gold. 
