I wish to explain one or two important changes in the school. las as enacted by the last General As-

First: The township is to be the unit of our public school system. The public schools in the township are under the control and management of the five school committeemen. These men have large discretion as to establishing schools in their townships. As a matter of fact, under the old law in many instances there are three buts, not school houses, each receiving \$75 per year. Under the new law it is possible to have, instead of the three cabins, one good school bouse near the center of the territory covered by the three cabins and have \$225 for this school. Thus we see that the total cost of an ordinary education in time and money is about \$1,900. These agures mean strict economy on the part of the student.
