Josiah was the last good king of Judah, and he reigned 31 years. In the thirteenth year of his raign Jeremiah began to prophsy and continued a prophet of the Lord for 40 years (Jer. i, 2, 3). It is written of Josiah in II Kings xxiil, 25, that there was no king either before or after him who like him turned to the Lord with all his heart and soul and might. Hezekiah exnothe Ford Building, corner Main | celled all others in his trust in the Lord (II Kings xviii. 3). Josiah began to reign at the age of 8 years. When he was 16, he began to seek God. When he was 20, he began to cleanse the land of idols. When he was 26, he repaired and cleansed the temple, and kept the greatest passover that had been kept since the days of Samuel (II Chron. xxxiv, 3, 8; xxxv, 18, 19). It was while they were working at the temple that they found this book of the law.

 Shaphan the scribe reported to the king that the money which had been gathered in the house of the Lord had been delivered to the overseers of the work, and it is said that they were so faithful that no reckoning was made with them of the money (verses 4-7). Josiah was possessed of a poor and contrite spirit and trembled at God's word (Isa, Ixvi. 2; Ivii. 15).
