PAY YOUR POLL TAX.

This is a general election year in which both State and county officers will be elected. Every Democrat, or every man who desires good government, whether he call himself a Democrat or something else, should feel it his duty to cast his vote for the man and measure his judgement approves, but there is one requirement now which has not prevailed heretofore, and one that might be overlooked by voters if attention was not called to it. We did this some months ago and now do it again, because it is a matter of importance.

The election law now requires that the voter shall have paid his poll tax (if liable to poll tax) on or before the first day of May in the year in which he offers to vote, and shall, before being permitted to vote, present his tax receipt signed by the sheriff of the county or tax collector of the county or township where he resides when the tax was paid. The law is mandatory, and the payment of the poll tax within the specified time is absolutely necessary. No poll tax, no vote, therefore every Democrat who values his vote and would not lose it, should, if he be liable to poll tax, take the precaution to pay it in time, get his tax receipt, and put it where it may not be lost before the day of election.

What Boys Should Read.

The younger men and the grown up boys may not have yet fully realized what a whirl indeed is the business life of this new century they have been hearing so much about. But whether they have or have not realized it, soon will find themselves in the midst of the whirl of business and the rush of work with little time for anything but attending to the duties of the tasks in hand.

Now whether a boy goes to college or not it is a great and helpful thing to have his mind stored with good knowledge when he enters upon his life's work whatever that may be. It is very desirable for the highest and best type of citizenship that all boys learn this early and follow the wisdom that such knowledge suggests.

Having accepted the truth that he will be the better citizen, the wiser and more successful man in life's struggle, according as he has a mind well stored with useful knowledge, the question naturally arises for the thoughtful boy as to when he should acquire such knowledge. And while it is true that a boy can no more acquire sufficient knowledge for his life's work before he begins it than a railroad engine can store up steam enough to run from New York to Jacksonville before starting, it is true that he can greatly prepare himself for learning many things before he comes to them.

In short when boys grow up to be men at more mature years they find that they have much less time for general reading than they thought they could have, even a few years before they reached manhood.

There are two strong reasons why boys and young men should read much and many good books in their earlier life. One is, because later they will not have the time; and the other is, if they do not form the habit of careful reading while reasonably young there is danger that they may not be so inclined in later years, even if they should be good fortune find time for much reading.
