The Post Office Scandal. Politics in Maryland. Mr. Morgan's Household Effects. (Special Washington Letter.)

4. No new registration of voters is required, but all qualified voters of the said town whose names are on the list of voters in said town, died, removed or in any way become disqualified to vote in said town, shall be entitled to vote in the election hereby called.

5. That E. S. Green be and is hereby appointed Registrar for the said election, and F. W. Wholes and E. C. Barrow be and are hereby appointed judges of the same.

6. That this call for said special election be published for thirty days in the Franklin Times, and a copy thereof posted at three public places in the town of Louisville, and that a copy of the aforesaid Act of the General Assembly be published and posted in connection with and as a part of this call.
