We strongly recommend our customers who have not done so to sow that splendid forage crop. If a sufficient quantity is sown. It will furnish a continuous daily supply of most nutritious green food for horses and all kinds of cattle all through the summer. It also makes splendid dry fodder, yielding enormously and being more nutritious and even better relished by all kinds of stock than corn fodder. In appearance it somewhat resembles Indian Corn, but the leaves are much larger and broader, and the stalks contain sweet sap. It produces a great number of shoots, very thickly covered with leaves, yielding an abundance of forage. It stools out enormously after being cut, as many as forty five stalks having green grown from a single seed. The first cutting can be made when it is two or three feet high. Sow in May or June at the rate of 2 or 3 pounds per acre, in drills 3 to 4 feet apart.
