For fifteen years the chairman of the County Democratic Executive Committee, for years a member of the Congressional and State executive committees and a delegate to the National Democratic Convention, his influence was strong. At the last State Convention he was continued as a member of the Central Executive Committee, his services proving always of value to the Democratic party. As a newspaper-man he had made the FRANKLIN TIMES a power in his county and section, one of the ablest of the exponents of Democracy and one of the best of county papers, having been its owner and editor for thirty years. His co-laborers of the State press, recognizing his worth, elected him as President of the State Press Association, a pu sition which he held in 1908-1909. 
