

ATTORNEY H. T. POWELL OF HENDERSON DIES

Formerly State Senator, Mayor of Natche City and Scion of Old Vaaco Family.

Henderson, July 24.—Mr. Henry T. Powell, a lawyer of this city, died this morning at his home here, after an illness of three weeks, of typhoid fever. Dr. Powell was a native of this community; his ancestors having lived here for generations. His father was for about 15 years sheriff of this county. He was of the age of thirty-seven years, and had been a member of the bar, in successful and active practice for about fourteen years; was educated at Trinity College and the University Law School; he was a member of the State Senate; in the year 1903, and served for some time as Mayor of Henderson, and also as recorder of the criminal court. He was very popular and highly regarded by all; his death will be learned of with much regret by all classes.

Mr. Powell leaves a wife, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George B. Harris of this city, and one child, Henry, a boy of about seven years. The funeral will take place tomorrow afternoon at 5 o'clock, and will be in charge of the bar of this city. Meeting of the bar and the county officers were held in the court house this morning to take steps in connection with the funeral and a committee was appointed to prepare resolutions to be presented to an adjourned meeting.

Mr. Powell was a member of the K. of P., and possibly of other fraternal organizations.

HEAD OF SCOTTISH RITE MASONS DIES

Rise of Sovereign Grand Commander Richardson Was Phenomenal.

Nashville, Tenn., July 24.—Major James Daniel Richardson aged 71 years Sovereign Grand Commander of the Scottish Rite Masons, Southern Jurisdiction, died at 4 o'clock this afternoon at his home at Murfreesboro, Tenn.

He had been in feeble health for four years. A serious turn for the worse came yesterday and he sank gradually from that time.

Major Richardson was born in Rutherford county, Tenn. and when 18 years old enlisted in the Confederate army as a private in the Forty-fifth Tennessee Infantry, serving later for three years as adjutant of that regiment. After the war he practiced law at Murfreesboro and was elected speaker of the Tennessee House of Representatives when 23 years old and was later a member of the State Senate.

He was elected to the Forty-ninth Congress from the Fifth District of Tennessee and served 18 consecutive years, being leader of the Democratic minority when he refused another nomination.

His rise in Masonry was phenomenal. Within a few months he was elected to office in that lodge and later in the lodge at Murfreesboro. He was Senior Grand Warden in 1871, Deputy Grand Master in 1872, and Grand Master of Tennessee in 1873 and Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter in Tennessee, Royal Arch Masons.

He was coronated Inspector-General of the Scottish Rite Masons in 1848, Supreme Council 1885, which was made vacant by the death of Odel S. Long, of West Virginia. He became Grand Commander when Grand Commander Thomas H. Creswell died in 1900 and at the next session of the Supreme Council was elected Sovereign Grand Commander for life. Duseh

Mr. E. T. Gupton Dead

We reproduce herewith an article from the Christian Index, of Naylor, Ga., which was written in memory of Mr. R. T. Gupton whose death was reported in these columns some weeks ago.

I reached home from a great meeting at Hebron church, Hernando county, Fla., today, at 12 o'clock, and found a letter awaiting me with the information that my best earthly friend, R. T. Gupton, of Naylor, Ga., was no more on earth. His daughter wrote me that he had passed away on June 27th from the effects of a sun-stroke. I have wept till it seems I can weep no more. "Bob" Gupton dead! No, it is not true. He was a child of God.

I was intimately associated with him as his pastor for three happy years. He was one of God's noblemen. Truly a prince in Israel has fallen.

He was a deacon of Naylor Baptist church from its constitution, was superintendent of the Sunday-school there, but was so modest that he never would superintend when his pastor was present. He was always faithful in his attendance upon all the services of his church, including the prayer meeting—notwithstanding the claims of his large earlier years he led a stormy life.

In 1913 he was genuinely converted and saved, uniting with the church very soon afterward. With a fiery nature, he was the finest example I have ever seen of the power of God's almighty grace to subdue the unruly passions of the human heart. Meek, childlike in faith, gentle as a woman, yet fearless as a lion in opposing wrong standing for the faith of the fathers.

Of large means, his money, his time, his all was on the altar of his God for service or sacrifice. He stood by his pastor with more than a brother's devotion. One part of his devotion to God took from in giving rebuke to any one, great or small, who used profanity. He said it was about the only way which he could make reparation for his treatment of God before He saved him. He was born in Franklin county, N. C., March 16, 1860.

He leaves a devoted wife and two noble daughters, besides a number of relatives and a host of friends to mourn his departure.

May the grace of the God of all grace abundantly sustain them in their hour of sore bereavement.
