DOING THINGS.

Nash County Health Officer Shows What One Man Can Do In Health

Vaccinating over 3,000 people in one anty against typhoid in about three months is a fine record. That is just what Dr. B. E. Washburn, whole time county health officer in Nash county, the first day of the white Better Bareports. During the month of August he immunized 1,531 people. The people of Nash county as well as their health officer seem to realide more than ever the real value of a health officer in saving lives and preventing sickness. The results of only a few months of this kind of work are beginning to show in the decrease in the typhoid fever season, there were ty. On August 31, at the height of the ytphoid fever season, there were only sixteen cases in the entire community. This is said to be much less

Basides the special work against typhois, the Nash County Health Officer during the last month vaccinated examined and treated twelve for hookworm disease, examined four specis of sputum for tuberculosis, rave eleven lectures on health subjects, bes doing the usual work formerly done by the county physician, namely. visiting the jail and county home and making commitment examinations for the State Hospital.

The story of the progress of health work is best told in the closing paragraph of the August report of the Health Officer, where he says: "Citisens in all parts of Nash County are ming interested in public health work, as is shown by the large attendance at the dispensaries.. The health officer is constantly called upon to give advice on problems relating to the betterment of sanitary conditions about the homes and places of work, and the demand for literature on health topics is also increasing. These things show that Nash County has developed to the point where th is realise the value; of health end are ready to co-operate in any en-deavor to prevent sickness."
