**NEWS OF THE NATION**

**ITEMS OF INTEREST CONDENSED FOR BUSY READERS**

Representative Lever, of South Carolina, author of the cotton futures law; recently declared unconstitutional by Federal Judge Hough, of New York, Wednesday re-introduced the bill. Mr. Lever said he had consulted many lawyers in the Senate and House and their opinion is substantially unanimous that the Supreme Court would not uphold Judge Hough.

Charges circulating during the last session of congress that administration officials acted in the interest of foreign business firms in urging the passage of the government ship purchase bill were held to be baseless in majority reports filed by the Senate committee appointed to investigate them.

Thursday Secretary Garrison laid before the House military affairs committee his formal argument in favor of the administration's army plan, which is designed to give the country a definite military policy. It proposes the creation of a mobile Federal force of more than a million men in six years.

Consul Garrels at Alexandria, Egypt, Friday advised the State Department that he had obtained affidavits from twenty-one survivors of the Persia, including Charles H. Grant, an American citizen and that all confirmed previous statements that no warning was given and that no vessel was seen.

Senator Fall, of New Mexico led the Republican attack Thursday on the administration's Mexican policy with a speech urging the adoption, of his resolution calling upon the president to place before Congress information on which he had based the recognition of Carranza.

Secretary of Commerce Redfield in a memorandum on business conditions transmitted to President Wilson recently, pictures the country as in the most prosperous state of its history. The warning is added, though, that war's inflation of commerce will last only until the war's end, and that business foresight alone will prepare the United States for peace.

Six of the eleven of the former directors of the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad, charged by the government with criminal violation of the Sherman Anti-trust law, were found not guilty by the jury that for

nearly three months had been trying the case. The jury disagreed on the five others.

Believing that the situation is well under control following two days of tranquillity after the rioting at Youngstown, Ohio, Friday night, preparations are being made to reopen the plants of the Youngstown Sheet and Tube Company in East Youngstown and Struthers. The riot Friday night cost the lives of two persons and resulted in property loss amounting to \$1,000,000.

After a week of open discussion in the Senate and House, congressional excitement over the foreign relations of the United States has been considerably allayed. Administration leaders appear to have succeeded in prevailing upon most of their colleagues to adopt a policy of patient waiting for complete investigation of recent war-zone incidents in which American lives were sacrificed.
