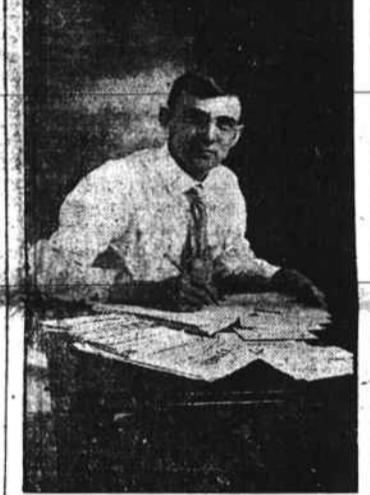
MR. JAMES E. COLLIE. Who was re-elected Chairman of the Democratic Executive Committee of Franklin County on last Saturday.
