## EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETS

Nominates Thomas C. Gill, of Hayesville, Surveyor, and A. F. Johnson, of Louisburg, Coroner—More Dates Made for Speaking.

In pursuance of the call issued by Chairman J. R. Collier, the Democratic Executive Committee for Franklin County, met in the court house in Louisburg at one o'clock Monday with all townships except Gold Mine and Cypress Creek represented. Chairman Collier called the meeting to order and stated the object of the call. The first business taken up was to make the nominations for the places vacant on the ticket. Mr. E. N. Williams, of Sandy Creek, after stating that in his opinion the Coroner should be a resident of Louisburg, so that he might be accessible at all times, placed in nomination, A. F. Johnson, Editor of the Times. No other nomination, Mr. R. B. White, of Franklinton, moved that the nomination be made by acclamation which was carried.

Mr. R. L. Stokes, of Hayesville, placed Mr. Thomas C. Gill in nomination for Surveyor. This was seconded by Mr. E. N. Williams and the nomination was made by acclamation after the formal motion.

It was ordered that the date for the speaking at Epsom be changed from Thursday, November 2nd to Friday, October 20th.

Mr. J. B. King brought before the Committee the importance of changing the voting precinct in Harris township from Clifton's Mill to Hagwood's store. Upon motion the Committee endorsed this action and appointed a committee composed of A. F. Johnson, R. B. White and C. C. Winston to take the matter up with the Board of Elections and secure the change if possible for the coming election.

No other business coming before the Committee adjournment was taken.
