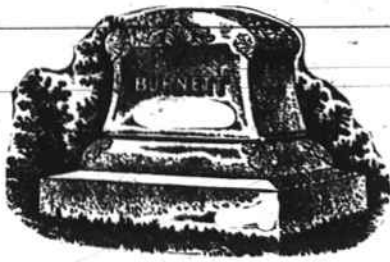

### Commissioners' Sale of Timber Land.

By virtue of an order of sale made by the Superior Court of Franklin County in that Special Proceedings entitled J. Burt Strickland et al vs. Mrs. Viole Joyner et al, the undersigned will on Tuesday, October 17th, 1916 at about the hour of noon, at the court house door in Louisburg, N. C. offer for sale to the highest bidder. First, all pine timber eight inches and up in diameter with three years time to cut and the usual rights, on that part of the lands of the late Mrs. Martha Strickland which is contained within the following boundaries:

FIRST—Beginning at end of hedgerow in open field Northeast of house, thence East along Hedgerow to a big gulley; thence Northeast along a blazed line to open field; thence southeast along open field to swamp; thence Southerly along Western edge of swamp to J.
