Notice to Teachers and School Committees.

Section 4161 of the Public School Law reads in part as follows:
"The Board of Education of each county shall fix annually a day and place in each township for the meeting of the township or district committees of said townships, who shall in conference with the county superintendent, with whom applications must have previously been filed by all applicants, select the teachers for their respective schools, except for rural public high schools; Provided that no election of any teacher or assistant teacher shall be deemed valid until such election has been approved by the county superintendent; and no voucher for the salary of a teacher of any school shall be signed by any county superintendent unless a copy of such teacher's contract has been filed with him as herein provided, and unless he shall have received satisfactory evidence that such teacher has been elected in strict accordance with this section. No contract for teachers' salary shall be made during any year to extend beyond the term of office of the committee nor for more money than accrues to the credit of the district for the fiscal year during which the contract is made."
