### CONDEMNNS THE CUSTOM.

#### The Sleeveless Sweaters A National Disgrace.

In an article contributed to the Raleigh Times Mrs. Harriet M. Berry, of Chapel Hill, takes the young women of the State and nation to task for wearing sleeveless sweaters. There is such great demand for sweaters making material, and the further fact that the Red Cross Society has had great difficulty in securing material needed for the soldiers now on the firing lines of France. Mrs. Berry says: "Are our young girls and women merely thoughtless, or are they entirely selfish and heedless of the great tragedy the world is facing? This thought is suggested by the numerous girls one sees on the trains, in other public places, wearing sleeveless sweaters."

Using up colored wools in knitting and crocheting sweaters. These sweaters are not to perform the natural function of a sweater, to keep out cold, but are used in the heat of summer to gratify a whim, a fad, a fancy of fashion.

"Few raw materials will be more precious the coming winter than wool. Our shortsightedness in not protecting the sheep industry has helped to aggravate this situation. A liberal supply means comfort for our soldiers and for the millions of men, women and children in various climes. A short supply means suffering and death to many. To gratify a fad, we will be directly responsible for this shortage. Sweaters will bring death and suffering to thousands. Are we willing to take the responsibility?"

"If thoughtlessness would be banished in normal times; now it is not. The Government should take steps to prohibit the manufacture of wool dress wool for such purposes."

"I see in the trenches many 'sleeveless' as one of the cardinal sins. Our girls are selfishly consuming, to no purpose, two of the most vital necessities in the world today—wool and labor. If all the time taken up in knitting fancy sweaters and similar articles were given to the Red Cross, think what it would mean in increased output for the Red Cross—and in character building for the girls!"

"Thoughtless, very few girls will read the 'Army Column' or the 'Fanny Page.' It is the hope, however, that the older generation will take hold of this matter, bring to the attention of the young girls and women a realization of their duty in the present crisis."
