In July, when our sugar stringency began to reach its height, consumption was reduced to 200,000 tons. In Au-gust only 325,000 tons went into dis-tribution and in September only 279, 000 tons. In October the distribution fell to 230,000 tons,

observe the injunctions of the Food Administration this country would have been in the threes of a sugar famine before the end of August; Oun visible supplies were so low as to tring visible supplies were so low as to bring great anxiety to those familiar with the sugar situation. They feared that it would be absolutely impossible to reduce consumption to a point where sugar would no longer be a mere luxary in the American diet.
