NEW POLICY FORMS

TOTAL AND PERMANENT DISABILITY

Waiver of all future premiums; and, in addition, A lifelong annual income to the insured; and, in addition, Full amount of policy paid at death, without deduction of the income payments or of the unpaid premiums. Inclusion of this provision is optional with the insured.

DOUBLE INDEMNITY

Double the sum insured will be paid in case of accidental death. Inclusion of this provision is optional with the insured.

LIFE INCOME

A monthly, or quarterly, or half-yearly, or yearly income, for life, if desired, instead of payment of the policy in a single sum.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Dividends automatically used to buy fully-paid-for additional insurance; or

May be drawn in cash; or
 May be used to reduce current premiums; or
 May be left to accumulate at interest, subject to withdrawal by the insured.

Choice of dividend use may be made at any time; no medical examination required.

Post-mortem dividend in first year, if death occurs.

Loan, cash surrender, paid-up insurance, extended insurance, after three years' premiums have been paid. And

Loan at end of first or second year toward payment of an accruing premium.

Interest not payable until maturity of loan.

Loans may be paid off in sums as small as \$10.
