Be It Ordained That the Following Regulations Be and The Same Are Hereby Adopted for The Government of The Handling and Sale of Food Stuffs in The Town of Louisville, N. C.

Section I. The term food or food stuffs as used in the regulations shall mean and include any articles used for human consumption as food or drink. The term food-handling establishment shall mean and include any factory, store, hotel, restaurant, lunch room, cafe, soda fountain, ice cream parlor, vehicle, cart, or other place where foods are manufactured, prepared, transported, handled, sold, offered for sale or given away for public consumption.

Section II. Every building or room used as a food-handling establishment in the Town of Louisville shall be constructed or reconstructed so as to conform to the following regulations:

- All floors, walls, or ceilings shall be of tight, sound material, easily cleaned.
- All doors, windows, or other openings which might permit the ingress of flies shall be covered, throughout the year with tight-fitting, sound wire screening of not less than 12 meshes to the inch, and all screen doors shall be equipped with suitable self-closing devices.
- Adequate washing facilities for the use of employees shall be provided, including a lavatory, an abundant supply of clean water—running where available—separate individual towels, No common towel shall be used, and be prohibited to be used in any food-handling establishment.
- Suitable and adequate equipment shall be provided for the storage or display of foods which must be protected from public handling, flies, dust, dirt, and other contamination.

Section III. Every wagon, cart or other vehicle used as a food-handling establishment in the Town of Louisville shall be so constructed as to be easily cleaned and provided with suitable and adequate equipment for the storage or display of foods which must be protected from public handling, flies, dust, dirt and other contamination.

Section IV. The sleeping or living quarters of any person employed in any food-handling establishment in the Town of Louisville shall be separate and apart from the room or rooms where food is manufactured, prepared, stored, handled, or sold.

Section V. No person, firm or corporation shall serve, sell, expose for sale or otherwise distribute in the Town of Louisville any food stuffs, except such as may be contained in unbroken packages or containers tightly closed or such fruits or vegetables as are usually peeled before being consumed, unless such food stuffs be protected at all times from public handling, flies, dust, dirt and other contamination by the use of wire screening of not less than 12 meshes to the inch, glass, metal, wood, or other substantial covering. Where food stuffs are displayed under a screen there shall be not less than 3 inches space between such food stuffs and such screen.

Section VI. No person, firm or corporation shall display or expose for sale in the Town of Louisville any food stuffs upon the sidewalk, or outside counters, or stands or vehicles, unless such food stuffs be at all times at least 2 feet from the sidewalk, floor or ground.

Section VII. No person, firm or corporation shall serve, sell, offer for sale, or otherwise distribute in the Town of Louisville any decomposed, rotted, fermented, filthy food stuffs or food otherwise unfit for human consumption, and the Superintendent of Health or his duly authorized agents shall be empowered to condemn and destroy any such foods as may be found in any food handling establishment.

Section VIII. Every vessel, glass, cup, dish or other utensil used in the consumption of food or drink in any hotel, restaurant, cafe, lunch room, soda-water fountain, ice cream parlor, stand, or other public eating place in the Town of Louisville shall after each individual service be thoroughly cleansed and then immersed in boiling water, or exposed to dry heat at 300 degrees F., or to live steam for not less than three minutes. Provided, that in lieu of the above requirement individual utensils for one service only may be used.

Section IX. No person suffering from any contagious disease shall work or be permitted to work in any food-handling establishment in the Town of Louisville. The Superintendent of Health shall have the authority to require a medical examination, by a regularly licensed physician, of any person employed in a food-handling establishment, whom he has reason to believe is affected with a contagious disease, and if such employee shall refuse such examination he shall not work or be permitted to work in such establishment.

Section X. The Superintendent of Health or his duly authorized agents, shall have the authority to make thorough inspections of any food-handling establishments in the Town of Louisville.

Section XI. The Superintendent of Health shall prescribe such rules for the inspection and control of sanitary conditions in such establishments as he may deem necessary to protect the public health. Whenever the sanitary conditions of any food-handling establishment shall, in the judgment of the Superintendent of Health, be such as to render the establishment a menace to the public health, said Superintendent of Health shall have the authority to forbid the sale of food stuffs from such establishment as long as such condition exists.

Section XII. All regulations or ordinances or parts of regulations or ordinances heretofore passed by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Louisville in conflict with these regulations are hereby repealed. And any violation of said regulations or any of them shall be punishable by fine not exceeding Fifty Dol-

lars or Imprisonment for a period not exceeding Thirty Days.
